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Habitat Celebrates **Second Annual Community Award Breakfast**

On Wednesday, May 27, 2026, Monroe County Habitat for Humanity proudly hosted our Second Annual Community Award Breakfast, **Honoring Our Past, Building Our Future**, graciously hosted by Camelback Resort. The event brought together community leaders, supporters, volunteers, partners, and friends to celebrate two significant milestones: the 50th Anniversary of Habitat for Humanity International and to recognize one of our longtime community partners, Lowe's Home Improvement, for their continued generosity and commitment to our mission.

Building on the success of last year's Blueprints & Breakfast, which honored Weiler Abrasives, this year's breakfast continued a growing tradition of bringing our community together in support of safe, affordable, and equitable housing throughout Monroe County. Seeing Faith, Hope, and Love in Everything that We Do

This was my talk from our **Annual Community Award Breakfast**.

We use words like faith, hope, and love all the time. They're beautiful words. Powerful words. But if we're honest, they can also become easy words—comfortable words. Words we say without asking much of ourselves.

We say we have faith.
We say we have hope.
We say we believe in love.

But what do those words really mean... if they never leave our lips and become something more?

Because the truth is this:
Faith is not just something you feel—it's something you do.
Hope is not just something you wish for—it's something you build.
And love... love is not just something you say—it's something you give away.

At Habitat for Humanity, we see this every single day.

We see faith when a volunteer picks up a hammer, not because they have to—but because they believe someone they may never meet deserves a safe place to call home.

We see hope when a family, who has faced setback after setback, chooses to believe that tomorrow can be different—and then shows up, puts in their sweat equity, and builds that future with their own hands.

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And we see love—real, tangible love—in the way a community comes together. Not just in words, but in action. In time given. In resources shared. In doors opened.

Because a home is more than four walls and a roof.

It's where a child can sleep safely at night.

It's where a parent can breathe a little easier.

It's where dignity is restored, stability is created, and futures begin.

And none of that happens because someone simply felt something.

It happens because someone acted.

Because someone decided that faith should look like a hammer and nails.

That hope should look like a foundation poured into the ground.

That love should look like a key placed into a family's hands.

So today, I want to challenge all of us—not to stop saying these words—but to start living them more boldly.

Let your faith move you. Let your hope drive you. Let your love cost you something.

Because when we turn these words into action, we don't just change houses—we change lives.

And maybe, just maybe, we change our own in the process.

Thank you for being people who don't just believe in faith, hope, and love—

...but who are willing to put them to work.

Habitat Toolbelt: Building Skills for the Community

On June 18, Monroe County Habitat for Humanity proudly launched the first session of our new monthly educational series, Habitat Toolbelt. Designed for local homeowners, DIY enthusiasts, and anyone interested in learning practical home improvement skills, the series provides hands-on instruction in a welcoming environment where participants can build confidence and learn from experienced professionals. Our inaugural workshop, "Measure Twice, Cut Once: The Art of the Perfect Cut," was held at the Monroe County Habitat ReStore and led by our Site Supervisor and Board of Directors member, Bill Snell.

Beginning at 11:00 AM, Bill guided attendees through the safe operation and proper use of a table saw, demonstrating techniques for making accurate, professional-quality cuts during the interactive session. Following the success of our first workshop, we are excited to announce our next Habitat Toolbelt session, "Stay Grounded: Electric Safety for Volunteers," taking place on **Thursday, July 16, at 11:00 AM at the Monroe County Habitat ReStore**. This session will focus on electrical safety while working on a jobsite, - practical knowledge and best practices for volunteers and homeowners alike. 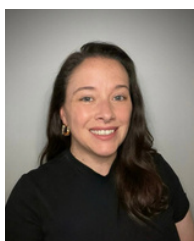

Summer Air Conditioner Maintenance: What to Do and Why It Matters

“Regular summer maintenance helps your air conditioner run efficiently when you need it most. Basic tasks include checking the air filter, clearing debris from the outdoor unit, and making sure vents and registers are open and unobstructed. A clean system circulates air more freely, reduces strain on the compressor, and keeps energy use lower.

Effective dehumidification is another key benefit of a well-maintained unit. When an air conditioner’s coils are clean and airflow is balanced, it can remove moisture from the air more effectively. Lower indoor humidity makes your home feel cooler, reduces the risk of mold growth, and helps protect wood floors and furniture from warping.

Maintenance also prevents larger, costly breakdowns. Small issues such as worn belts, clogged drain lines, or low refrigerant can turn into major repairs if ignored. Routine service keeps temperatures consistent, extends system lifespan, and helps ensure your AC is ready for heat waves.”
